2021-2023 Proposed Biennium Budget Discussion

Last year, a one-year budget, 2020-2021, was approved at Conference to cover the second year of the biennium. This year we are proposing a biennium budget for 2021-2023. **Only credential individuals are eligible to vote.**

Income:

- We have kept the membership expectation the same at 360 x \$15 for a total income of \$5,400 per year.

Foundation Income:

- We hosted a Bingo at Workshop to cover the 2020 Gaby Award 2020. It raised \$1,097.50.

Foundation Expenses:

- 2020 Gaby Award (Foundation Lamplighter, \$500 donation in the name of the winner)
- Additional \$597.50 was donated to Foundation. Any monies received for Foundation goes to Foundation. Income and Expenses balance out.

Board Expenses:

- On a regular basis your board is very frugal with Club Visit cost. This year with the Covid-19 Pandemic, many club visits were done via Zoom meetings, at no cost to District. We are recommending reducing Club visit line item to \$1,500 per year.
- Board Meetings:
 - We did not meet face-to-face this year. Instead all meetings were accomplished via Zoom. We have allowed for a face to face meeting of the new board and committees. We recommend decreasing this line item to \$2,000 per year.
 - This year we purchased Zoom Pro at a cost of \$150 to accommodate all Board meetings and any other District business. We recommend keeping this item in the budget.

Operating Expenses:

- We are still allocating \$300 for Insurance/Bonding in the budget. (This has not been used in the recent past.) Considering what we went through this year, we recommend carrying this insurance in the future.
- We have deleted the Money Exchange line which covers the exchange rate between Canadian and US dollar, which no longer applies. Canadian clubs will pay District Dues (\$15) and Conference Fee (\$25) in US Dollars.
- In 2021-2023, you will see a line item for Governor-Elect Training and Convention expenses. This applies for the first year (2021-2022) of the biennium. The Governor's Pin expense is applied to (2022-2023).

Use this page to keep track of your Silent Auction Bidding!!!

The Super Silent Auction is here!



So, how are we doing the super silent auction? It's really very, very simple.

Below is a link that will take you to a sheet with all the items on it and a place for you to enter your bids. But don't go there yet – please read the following notes first:

- Bidding opens on Wednesday, April 21st at 8:00 am. Before then you will be able to see the document in progress (even if not done), but you will not be able to enter a bid until I 'flip the on-switch' at 8am.
- When you first open the document, it may take a moment for all the images to load. Breathe, relax, and then presto, they should be there!
- The bidding works just like our standard silent auction. Merely type in your bid, name, email, and club on the next empty line in the block for each item you are bidding for. That's it. There is no need to hit "share" or do anything else.
- This is a live document which will update automatically as others type their bids. If you see someone outbidding you – get right back there and bid again!!
- If all the lines fill up for an item I will be adding more as necessary, so text me a quick note if I haven't done so. Please do not write over anyone's bid.
- If you open this on your phone you should be able to see it, but you may need to download an App if you want to bid by phone. Alternatively, just go to your computer. Or if that's not an option, simply text me at 207-929-0964 with all the relevant info and I'll enter your bid for you.
- Bidding will be open until 3pm on Saturday, April 24th so you will have some time to bid after the Saturday morning session closes. I will be flipping the "off-switch" exactly at 3:00 pm so no additional bids will be accepted after that.
- The winning bidders will be announced when we reconvene Saturday evening at 4:00 pm. I will also email each winner with the item they "won" and their bid.

Conference Rules and Procedures April 23-24, 2021

1. The voting body at this conference shall consist of members of the District One Board of Directors; regularly accredited delegates from clubs within the District; and Past Governors, holding active membership in their respective local Altrusa Clubs or who are affiliate members. Members of the voting body shall have one vote on each question to come before the assembly. No person is entitled to more than one vote. (District Bylaws, Article VI, Section 7)
2. A majority of the members who are entitled to vote shall constitute a quorum and the act of the majority of members at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the members of the District. (District Bylaws, Article VI, Section 6)
3. Only voting members may introduce motions and vote, but all non-voting members shall be allowed the privilege of speaking to a motion.
4. Each member has the right to speak twice on the subject, but may not make a second speech on the subject as long as any other member who has not spoken desires to speak on it. Debate is limited to two minutes per speech.
5. Debate must remain germane to the Motion.
6. Speakers must direct their debate through the Chair. An individual must identify themselves by name and club prior to speaking.
7. Upon the making and seconding of a motion, the maker of the motion shall email the motion to the District Governor and District Secretary.

8. A motion may be withdrawn while pending if general consent of the voting body is given.
9. If possible, all members shall “mute” their devices, while they are not talking, to avoid background noise interrupting the conversation.
10. The latest edition of Robert’s Rule of Order, Newly Revised, will be the Parliamentary Authority. The parliamentarian interprets meeting rules and advises the presiding officer of parliamentary procedure.



District One Board Reports

Lucia Shannon, District Director and District Archives Chair

Covid killed the phrase “but we have always done it this way.” For what did not work anymore, new methods needed to be implemented. Communication, information, service, meetings, and exchange of service and goods had to be “reformatted” for access and safety.

Archives lodged in locked libraries and other institutions, as in the case of Plymouth County, provided a new perspective that access via the cloud, website storage, or other electronic means needed to be considered and enacted; the flash drive becomes our mobile tool.

Meetings, with social distancing worked between surges, but zoom became the reliable norm. Some members, both young and old, new and seasoned, took a sabbatical, most embraced the new technology over time.

As a director visiting clubs via zoom, covid presented a challenge that both Central Connecticut and Greater Biddeford – Saco overcame. Members of both clubs ran smooth meetings, using zoom etiquette, adding some traditional Altrusa elements to meetings like the pledge of allegiance, and in some cases zoom allowed snowbirds the opportunity to join in seamlessly, not to mention those with mobility issues in winter weather. Both clubs conducted cordial meetings where each person’s contribution enhanced the conversation, leading to better decisions.

Most impressive, both clubs succeeded in maintaining service projects while growing new ones. Service hours remained steady, but essentially “remote”. A mentoring program for twelve-year old boys of Latino and/or Black heritage which focuses on reading is an initiative partnered by Central Connecticut, NAACP, and Middletown public schools. Greater Biddeford- Saco has finessed financial support for a teen alternative school, by making cash donations and supplying needed items to their school. Both clubs maintain scholarships, help newborns, and contribute food, all much needed help this year.

It was fun to travel without getting lost. Meeting new members and seeing friendly, familiar faces reignited my enthusiasm for Altrusa. I look forward to seeing everyone at our Fall Workshop!

In November 2019, the Foundation inaugurated its new quarterly newsletter, *The Impact*. It is inspiring to read about the results of the grants awarded and the faces of Altrusa. *The Impact* also provides up-to-date information on requesting grants, whether for our own clubs' service projects, for a worthy individual, for disaster relief, or Club 21 camps and projects. If you are not receiving *The Impact*, please let me know.

There have been several Zoom meetings for the Liaisons during this biennium, focused on sharing ideas with each other and getting updates from the Foundation Director and Board members. I have shared that information with you in the DSBs and occasional emails to club presidents.

AIF has also instituted new fundraisers like last fall's Day of Giving campaign which raised over \$54,000. Giving has never been easier when all it takes is a quick text! Another campaign is in the works even as you read this, the 'Spring Back into Things' campaign, from April 1st to June 30th, with awards again to the clubs that raise the most funds, in total and per capita. (See the February Impact, Issue 5 for more information.)

And speaking of fundraising, I want to sincerely thank all the clubs who have contributed to District One's fundraising efforts these past two years. With no in-person Conference during this biennium we had to be creative and flexible. The Bingo game at Workshop last fall was one such solution. And a highly successful one, for we raised almost \$2,200 which was split between the club of the lucky winner and a donation to Foundation. I am quite confident that our virtual auction at this conference is going to be even more successful; the items that clubs have donated are amazing! My thanks to you all for supporting this effort.

2021 Mamie L. Bass Service Project Submissions (7)

Central CT – CLOSE=Children’s Luggage Offers Self Esteem

When children are removed from foster care and their personal belongings are placed in large garbage bags, they suffer humiliation, shame, unworthiness and resentment. We set out to change this by soliciting donations of luggage, duffel bags or zippered totes to be used when foster children are moved. To date, 81 pieces of luggage have been provided to the agency.

Carroll County – COVID Christmas Celebration for Foster Families

Because of COVID-19, the annual Christmas party for foster families of Carroll County was reconfigured to a drive-by celebration including Santa’s greetings, a backpack and personally selected book for each child and a family gift bag filled with treats. Our member “elves” helped Santa spread some Christmas joy in a fun but safe way.

Greater Biddeford-Saco - Pivoting in Response to COVID

COVID would not deter us. The Greater Biddeford-Saco, ME club pivoted to work with our community partners, make changes and continue to serve. We increased our donations to respond to increased food needs in pantries and at meal sites. We provided school supplies for the kids and photo holders for health care workers. We’re ready...when this is over...to pivot again.

Laconia – Cheering up the Elderly

Altrusa International of Laconia, NH, decided that since they couldn’t continue projects at the Belknap County Nursing Home, due to Covid-19, they would send each resident a personally addressed, hand- made card, saying “Hello” and letting them know we were thinking of them during these difficult times.

Northeastern CT – Messages of Hope

Altrusa of Northeastern Connecticut reached out with personal messages to clients at the NO Freeze Shelter and the Next Step Cottage. Members wrote notes of encouragement and delivered two hundred forty-five cards, a combination of cards with personal notes and blank cards with stamped envelopes. This project brought smile to many during a difficult time.

Portland – Pillowcases and Books

Altrusa Portland partnered with a local non-profit group, Cricket Comforts, to thematically match books we received from a Books-a-Million book drive, with Pillowcases sewn by their volunteers. Covid restrictions required these 150 books and pillowcases be carefully cleansed and placed in ziploc bags. These were delivered and gifted to pediatric patients at the Barbara Bush Children’s Hospital.

Seacoast – This Snack’s On Us

Altrusa of the Seacoast provided each of 300 York Hospital and its Wells, Maine satellite employees with large, well-balanced individual “thank you” snack bags. Lindt Chocolate’s huge donation further enabled us to provide large baskets of chocolates to the York Fire, Ambulance, Police and EMT departments – along with two local Assisted Living facilities.

2021 Letha H. Brown Literacy Project Submissions (10)

Bermuda – Reading Writing and Zooming

Bermuda Club donated a laptop and Microsoft package to Teen Haven, a home for young at-risk teenage women to assist them to continue classes and sharpen their reading skills. This home empowers the young women to maximize their potential, increase self-esteem and coping skills in order to make healthier choices in life by promoting ongoing education, counseling and support.

Carroll County - Book Bags for Babies

Book Bags for Babies gives a handcrafted cloth bag filled with books for infants and guidance to parents of newborns. The guidance is to encourage the parents to read to their babies now and all through their childhood. Also included in the bag is the information about the Cook Memorial Library and all of its children's programs.

Central CT - Crisis Averted at the Early Learning Center

The goal of this project was to provide the necessary books and continue the on-going routine of reading a new book daily helping children of the Town and Country Early Learning Center nurture the love of reading. Due to the pandemic, libraries were closed limiting access to books. Altrusans working together with the community averted this crisis.

Greater Biddeford-Saco - Adopting a Schoolful of Little Ones

With the goal of exposing little ones to the joy of being read to and the joy of reading on their own at home, we adopted 300 students K thru 2nd grade. Our project consisted of live reading events, book distributions, local author presentation, gifts of books about multicultural issues and Covid masks.

Meredith - Got Lunch/ Got Books

It is a proven fact among teachers that many at-risk young children experience a "summer slide of reading skills". Recognizing this, the Meredith Literacy Committee worked with "Got Lunch!" providing pre-packaged, labeled by family, high-interest, age-appropriate magazines that were included with summer lunch deliveries to over 400 children (ages 4 through 13+) from 2018 through 2020.

Merrimack Valley - Brigid's Crossing - Leading with Literacy to a Better Community

Altrusa Club of Merrimack Valley provides themed birthday parties for children living with their mothers at Brigid's Crossing in Lowell, a shelter for at-risk, teenage mothers. The birthday child receives an educational toy and age-appropriate book and the children attending the party receive age-appropriate books in lieu of goodie bags. Each celebration includes juice boxes, hoodies, and cake/cupcakes.

Northeastern CT - Read to Grow Windham: Books for Families

With schools and libraries closed, we worked with the Windham Public Schools to provide books to families at free meal sites. Collaborating with Read to Grow, book distributors, 4500 books of all levels in English and Spanish were given out at eighteen distributions in June, 2020.

Portland – Forever Books

COVID-19 strikes. Altrusa Portland pivots!! In the recent past, Altrusa reached children via in person visits with small group read alouds. With COVID-19 restrictions, Portland Altrusa began creating collections of **Forever Books** that could be delivered to teachers for distribution to both in-person and remote learners. We connected books of quality with 1,114 students and 26 teachers

Sanford-Springvale - Black and White Book

The purpose of the “Black and White Book” grant project is to serve families with newborns with the goal of preventing adverse childhood events and enhancing lifetime literacy through early childhood home visitation, family engagement and the fostering of parenting skills in alignment with the current goals of the CDC.

Seacoast - Read Me a Story

Altrusa of the Seacoast created a method for our existing literacy program to continue safely during a pandemic to benefit Students with disabilities at the Birchtree Center. Creative use of technology allowed current and future students to have access to individual literacy experiences. Students and staff greatly appreciate our program, requesting the program continue until we can return to the school.


