During her biennium, President Folley has set forth a Literacy Challenge for all Altrusans. There are so many things you can do start a book club or a book exchange, establish a children's library in a youth center or free clinic, donate bookshelves and books to an underprivileged neighborhood, adopt an underprivileged school and establish a free library for them, work with schools and youth clubs to furnish books for their students.

Remember the club who distributes the most books will be recognized during the 2023 Convention in San Antonio. If we *Unite* together we can reach the goal of <u>One Million Books in the hands of One Million Children/People</u>. If you are having issues or need help with either of these issues please reach out to the Leadership team.
- It is Club Annual Report time again. It was released on March 15 and is due June 1. It contains 23 questions to help us record important data which will be provided to District and International Boards to help us better serve our clubs. Clubs can also use the report to get ideas for how they can become stronger. Please answer the questions for the club year April 1, 2021, through March 31, 2022. You need to score 65% and have charter status to become a 2021-2022 Distinguished Club.
- Your Leadership team is gearing up for Governor-Elect training which will be held this summer. Your future Governor will get an in-depth look into the new role she is about to undertake and will learn many valuable tips to bring back with her.
