ENDOWMENT

- ·Established in 1992
- •Chief source of income for all charitable activities of the Foundation
- •Designated Funds only interest/dividends can be spent

SPECIAL CAMPAIGNS AND ANNUAL FUND

- Annual Funds are year-long (fiscal) initiatives that support the general operational needs of the Foundation
- Credit is given towards Club Service Awards



- Disaster Recovery and Relief
- Available year-round
- Grants from \$250-\$2,500
- Requests exceeding \$2,500 need Board approval
- Application and descriptive narrative are required
- Aid should benefit at least 100 community members



GRANTS PROGRM

- Provides financial support to Altrusa Clubs, ASTRA Clubs, and Districts
- Community service projects
- Grants from \$250-\$4,000

CLUB 21

- Established in 1997 to support organizations that aim to meet 21st century needs, primarily in thea areas of healthcare, education, economic development, and leadership
- Designated Fund
- Individual Members
- Club Level
- District Level



This type of general donation meets the most pressing needs of Foundation

Club 21 Annual Membership

- Supports children and their families affected by disease and disability, and educational healthcare programs in West Africa
- ❖\$21.00 per year qualifies an individual as a Club 21 member
- \$210.00 qualifies an Altrusa Club or District as a Club 21 member
- Individuals receive a one-time Club 21 pin; Districts/Clubs receive a one-time Club 21 medallion.
- Membership renews annually from the date dues are paid, but many clubs collectively renew memberships in April-May.
- Does not count towards Lamplighter contribution progress

Planned Giving and Annual Club 21 Membership

Planned Giving

- As the name suggests, planned gifts are donations that are set up now to be donated at a future date.
- Planned giving donations are usually arranged for after a donor has passed away and can also be referred to as legacy giving.
- While legacy gifts are often made as a bequest in a donor's will, they can take other forms as well, including:
- gifts of life insurance,
- charitable annuities,
- charitable remainder trusts, and
- gifts of stocks or securities.
 - All Planned Giving bequests to the Altrusa International Foundation are restricted to the Endowment Fund

GRANTS APPLICATION PROCESS

GRANTS PROGRAM DEADLINES: TWO CYCLES PER YEAR: CYCLE ONE (SEPTEMBER 15) AND CYCLE TWO (MARCH 15)



ELIGIBILITY AND TYPES OF GRANTS

One (1) Grant per Cycle per Club, District, and ASTRA Club

- Service Project Grants (\$250-\$4,000)
- Individual Grants (\$4,000,one-time)
- New ASTRA and Altrusa Club Charter Grant (\$2,000, one-time)
- Club 21 (international and childrens' camps, up to \$4,000)



HOW TO APPLY

- Coverletter, program narrative (answer all questions), and program budget
- Application materials are available on the website
- Only complete applications with the appropriate signatures will be accepted.



FOLLOW UP REPORT DEADLINE

12-months from receipt of grant funding



ALL GRANT APPLICATIONS SHOULD BE <u>EMAILED</u> TO FOUNDATION@ALTRUSA.ORG (DO NOT MAIL OR FAX)

AN ADDITIONAL GRANT WORKSHOP WILL BE HELD AT THE 2023 INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION.

- The number of grants funded and the award amount of each grant are dependent upon available funding and the number and quality of applications.
- **The Altrusa International Foundation, Inc. reserves the right to make the final decision on all applications.**
- The Foundation strongly encourages applicants to seek other sources of funding in the event the grant request is not or is partially funded.



- In celebration of the Foundation's 60th anniversary, the Foundation has launched a 2-year campaign which replaces last year's Project Generosity Challenge.
- The Foundation asks Altrusans and friends to contribute at one or more of the six suggested giving levels:
- 1. \$60 (Light Blue)
- 2. \$160 (White)
- 3. \$260 (Teal)
- 4. \$560 (Dark Blue)
- 5. \$860 (Maroon)
- 6. \$1,060 (Gold)



- All gifts will receive a special commemorative ribbon unique to each gift level.
- For all gifts since June 1, 2022, credit will be given to this campaign. Cumulative gifts, with the exception of Club 21, over \$500 USD made in each fiscal year will be eligible for Lamplighter recognition
- Each District will have a unique Mobile Cause fundraising page to share. For this giving campaign, we are
 asking that Districts create their own "challenge" among its membership to exceed last year's giving by 10%
 (Per District goal is \$12,000).

Contributions made between May 1, 2022-January 31, 2023 will be recognized with the color-matched ribbon at the District conference so that members may celebrate their support of this campaign. Recognition will also be given to 6 for 60 supporters at the International Convention for all cumulative gifts, except Club 21, made through May 31, 2023.

The 6 for 60 Giving Campaign (cont.)

All contributions received across all programs from June 1-May 31 will be counted towards the Debby Weber Fundraising Awards.

The Debby Weber Fundraising Awards

- First place winners will receive \$1,500
- Second place will receive \$750
- Third place will receive \$500

The Debby Weber Fundraising Awards are named in honor of former International Foundation Trustee Debby Weber. The service awards will go to the winning Altrusa Clubs, and individual gifts count towards the club's total. The top three Altrusa Clubs with the largest fundraising gifts, and top three Altrusa Clubs with the largest gifts per capita, will receive the awards.

Contributions made between May 1, 2022-January 31, 2023 will be recognized with the color-matched ribbon at the District conference so that members may celebrate their support of this campaign. Recognition will also be given to 6 for 60 supporters at the International Convention for all cumulative gifts, except Club 21, made through May 31, 2023.

ONLINE DONATIONS & MOBILE CAUSE FUNDRAISING

- Mobile Cause is a giving software that securely processes the online credit card and PayPal payments (only).
 - It also allows for text-to-give, simplifying the donation process even further.
 - It does not track gifts made by check or money order (may not reflect complete giving record by District).
- The Foundation website NOW PROCESSES INTERNATIONAL CREDIT CARD TRANSACTIONS
- Mobile Cause also allows the Foundation to create fundraising webpages for the entire organization, Districts, and for special fundraising campaigns such as Project Generosity and the 6 for 60 Giving Campaign.
- As with previous campaigns, each District has been assigned a unique fundraising webpage and link that can be shared with its donors.
- The fundraising page will allow the Districts and the Foundation to track progress towards fundraising goals
 in real time.
 - Districts can also see the Leaderboard that will show which Districts are leading in fundraising dollars and number of donors (good competition!)

For a \$210 USD Club or District-level gift
