He enjoys applying his business skills to increase Rotary service and engagement as the Zone 25b / Zone 29 Innovative Club Advocate appointed by the Rotary International Board of Directors.

Plano West Rotary is the Fastest Growing Club in North America. It tripled its membership to majority women, people of color, and under 50 by implementing the Rotary Action Plan with 75 service projects last year and averaging 6 projects a month today. He did this by focusing on who his community was and finding service projects that they would invite prospective members to volunteer for.

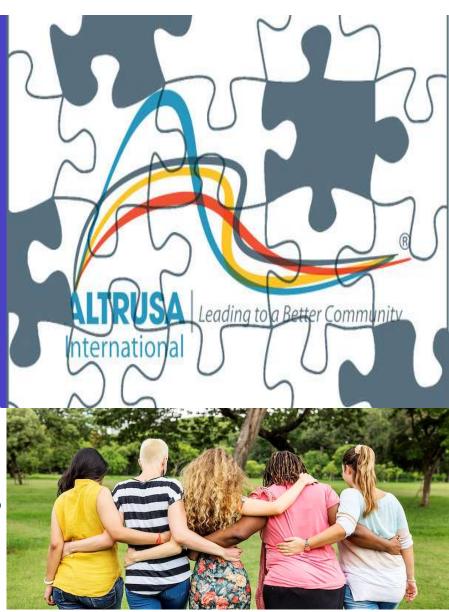

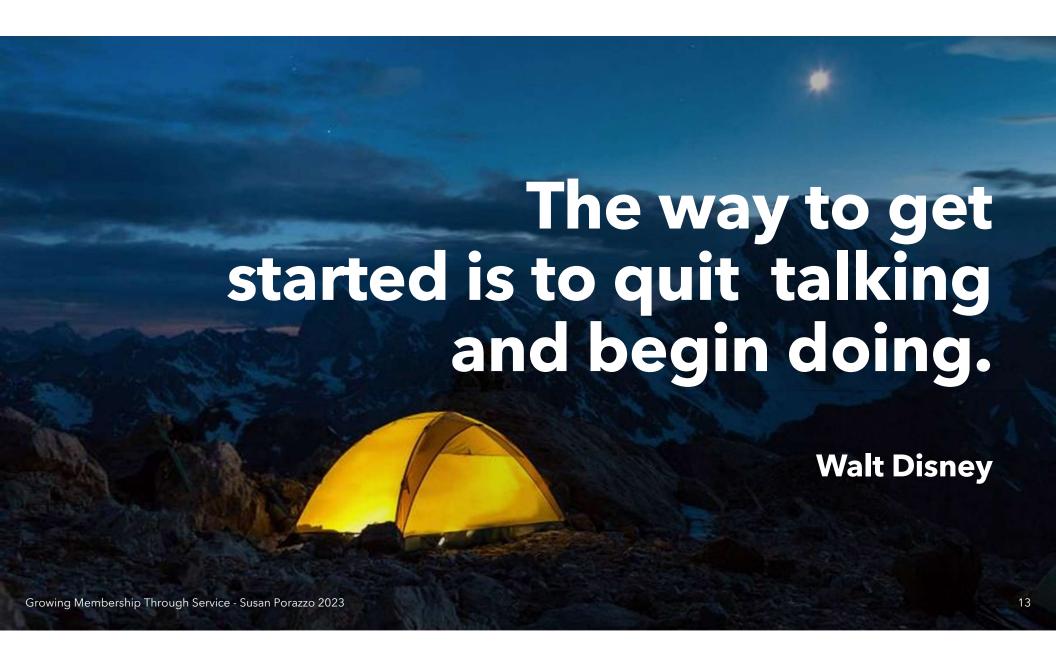
Summary
