



Cancellations and Room Guarantees:



Monetary donations are welcome if you do not have access to fleece fabric

Altrusa of the Seacoast has been donating fleece no-sew blankets for the homeless for several years. As our Conference project this year we would like attendees to donate fleece and assist us tying blankets.

All fleece should be of good quality ('anti-pill' or 'Blizzard') because of the wear and tear they receive.

Each blanket takes two yards of a patterned fabric for the front and two yards of a coordinating plain fabric for the back. Keep in mind these go to both men and women. Please no white or very light colored fleece as washing machines are hard to come by in the woods.

You can provide enough for a whole blanket or pair up with another member, so one brings the front fabric and one brings the back fabric. At a good sale at JoAnn's Fabric, you can get fleece for as low as \$5.00/yard!

Join us Friday afternoon between 3:00 to 4:30 to help us tie blankets and learn how to make them!



Awards have been an important part of human society for centuries, serving as a means of recognizing achievement and motivating individuals to strive for excellence. Awards recognize and celebrate

outstanding achievements, talent, and contributions.

Service Awards are a good way to share with other Clubs what we are doing, and to recognize outstanding achievement. They provide guidelines for running a successful project.

The best time to begin is before you start the project. By reviewing the application. Then you can document your efforts as they happen. This should make filling out the application easier, since you already have the information, you need.

This year International revised their application formats to be alike. You can find the new applications on the International web site under Service. Please make sure you use the 2023 forms.

The changes made are the synopsis can now be 100 words, supporting documentation is limited to six pages. The District Awards Chair, Ann Milliard, will remove all pages beyond the first six pages before sending the packets to the judges, and the narrative is limited to 1000 words. If the District Awards Chair, receives the application prior to the deadline, March 15, 2024, and if there are any issues you will be notified. Then you may make the necessary changes and resubmit prior to the March 15, 2024, deadline.

Greetings Altrusans! On behalf of the International Foundation, I would like to welcome you and to thank you for your generosity in supporting the Foundation. District Conference is an exciting time where we reconnect with friends, learn about best practices and service projects, and it is also an opportunity to learn more about the Foundation.

For over 60 years, the Altrusa International Foundation, Inc. has supported our Clubs throughout the world. Through the grants process, which happens twice a year, Clubs are provided with the financial resources to support their service projects, as well as funding provided to multiple children's camps through Club 21 donations. The Foundation also has a special Disaster Relief fund. These funds are used to support local communities after a disaster. A recent example of Disaster Relief support was assistance to individuals displaced by the fires in Maui.

During the District Conference, please consider donating to the International Foundation. Your District Liaison is a resource for you and will be conducting fundraising activities during the conference. I also encourage you to become a member of Club 21, become a Lamplighter or add another diamond to your Lamplighter pin or to your Hofmeister pendant

The Foundation provides another valuable resource to the Altrusa community. The Foundation shares its IRS tax-exempt charity designation with more than 130 local foundations via a group tax-exemption and is a resource to its affiliated local foundations. The Foundation provides Bylaw templates and guidance to local club foundations thereby facilitating compliance with IRS requirements. This allows these local foundations to fundraise as tax-exempt charities. Altrusa provides the resources that further the work of local clubs, *Leading to a Better Community*.

As the philanthropic partner to the Association, the Foundation provides the funding for each of the

WHY CREDENTIAL REPORTS?

In the next month or so, your Altrusa Club will receive information from the District Treasurer pertaining to the number of Delegates and Alternates which your Club is entitled to have to represent you at the District One Spring Conference.

The Bylaw reads:

Each Club in good standing in International that has a total Active membership of fifteen (15) or less for whom dues have been paid to International, shall be entitled to one (1) delegate and one (1) alternate. For each additional fifteen (15) members or portion thereof, a Club shall be entitled to one (1) additional delegate and alternate up to a maximum of five (5) delegates and five (5) alternates. (The alternate assumes the role of delegate, when the delegate is not able to serve at Conference.)

We all know that in order to transact business at a regular Club business meeting a **Quorum** is required.

Conference is the Annual Business Meeting of the District and like your Club, Altrusa International Bylaws require a *Quorum* in order to transact business.

From the Conference Rules and the District Bylaws, the voting body at the conference consists of members of the District One Board of Directors; accredited delegates from clubs within the District; and Past Governors, holding active membership in their respective Altrusa Clubs or Past Governors who are affiliate members. (District Bylaws, Article VI, Section 7)

The above **Sample** Credentials Page from a recent District Conference Program booklet outlines all the District One Clubs and the associated number of Delegates and Alternates. (The numbers for 2024 will be different.)

At Spring Conference, the Credentials Chair will give reports at each of the business sessions on how many Delegates and Alternates; District Board Members and Past District Governors are present at the Conference. By providing the total number of eligible voters PRESENT at the meeting, the Credentials Chair provides the basis for a quorum as well as what constitutes a majority vote.

A majority of the members registered at Conference who are entitled to vote shall constitute a quorum and the act of the majority of members at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the members of the District. (District Bylaws, Article VI, Section 6)

This year, the final business session will take place on Sunday morning, and the District Board realizes that some delegates may leave before the final session. Therefore, it is important for the Credentials Chair to know the number of delegates who will not be participating in the final business session and /or which alternates are assuming the role of delegate. This will be addressed at Conference and what your club's delegate or alternate may be required to do.



Though we were far from scary, a spook-tacular time was had by all.




