December 14, 2023,

Susannah Leslie and Lucia Shannon delivered the gifts to the STARR residence. Two young teens and the Weymouth director, Maria Melpignano greeted us and helped us bring in the bags and packages. For privacy reasons personal photos were not encouraged.

In 2013 the Service Committee proposed changing our annual Christmas project from families to teens. Ann Jarvinen, with former member Sheila Blake, indicated that teens in crisis are often overlooked during the Christmas season. Ann learned of the STARR program from a coworker at South Shore Hospital and a connection was made with Director Scott Thompson who ran the Plymouth location at the time. The club unanimously voted for the new project. Knowing that teens would now have something to open on Christmas Day, all members embraced this project and were excited to shop for gifts. Ten years later, the same spirit endures. Over the years, modifications were made to accommodate social changes, particularly covid. Both new and old members have added an Amazon account to involve interested donors from the public, streamlined the shopping, and yet maintained the joy of giving.

News from Jou Nouvo's CEO and Former Altrusan, Kerline Tofuri

"We are delighted and proud to introduce our new Program Director,
Lynn Balmir, formerly the Manager of our Girls' Scholar Program. Lynn is an
enthusiastic, mission-driven leader who has successfully managed the GSP program
since its inception. She was instrumental in designing this program to reduce the high
school dropout rate among young girls in Bon Repos. She has led a group of volunteer
tutors and established partnerships with local leaders to support the girls in their
education and provide the mentoring they need to develop. Two years later, under
Lynn's leadership, despite challenges and disruption, we have supported over 110 girls
through GSP and maintained a 100% graduation rate.

Despite indescribable acts of violence affecting all genders and widespread fear in the neighborhoods, our center remained open, providing crucial services. Meaningful discussions took place at our center, bringing together our program participants and staff. We conducted workshops for program participants and provided various trainings for our staff. Despite families being forced to leave their homes in Bon-Repos, the majority of our children continue to attend classes at our partner schools.

Our center remains a beacon of hope in the Bon-Repos community, serving as a safe gathering place for girls, women, staff, university students, and all the families we are honored to support. We rely on your continued support to navigate the challenges ahead. Since we began our series of 1-hour virtual sessions last month with our Development Officer, Nikenson Romage, to update our supporters and friends on Jou Nouvo's progress in Bon Repos, the response to our invitation has been enthusiastic, and we are grateful for the opportunity to connect with more people moved by our mission."

Winter Warming from Pat Monteith



PERFECT FOR A COLD WINTER'S NIGHT - SWEET POTATO SOUP INGREDIENTS

- 2 4 tablespoons butter
- 2 medium yellow onions, chopped.
- 2 1 tablespoon ginger powder
- 2 1-pound carrots, peeled and chopped into 1-inch pieces
- 2 1½ pounds sweet potatoes (about 2-3 small), peeled and chopped into 1-inch pieces.
- 2 8 cups of vegetable broth
- 2 1 level teaspoon salt
- 2 1 tart yet sweet apple (such as Honeycrisp or Fuji), peeled and chopped.
- 2 tablespoons honey
- 2 ½ teaspoon ground black pepper

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. In a large pot, melt the butter over medium heat. Add the onions and cook, stirring frequently,
- until soft and translucent (about 10 minutes). Don't brown the onions. Add the ginger powder and cook a minute more.
- 2. Add the carrots, sweet potatoes, vegetable broth and salt and bring to a boil. Cover and simmer over low heat until vegetables are very tender (about 25 minutes). Stir in the apples and honey.

Puree the soup in a blender in batches. Season to taste with salt, pepper, and more honey if necessary. If it's too soupy, let it stand for 20 minutes to thicken.

3. Ladle soup into bowls (and I always sprinkle with more ginger powder).
