## **Highlights from business meetings:**



Club members decided to meet via ZOOM during January and February. There is always the possibility of storms, bad roads and rescheduling isn't very easy. ZOOM has offered us the opportunity to have a meeting. Short and sweet.

January 9th: Highlights:

- Beth explained what Club 21 (Altrusa International Foundation) was, that our club has donated \$210 to this foundation and that our club could sponsor the Laura Foundation for a potential Grant. The club voted to support the Laura Foundation with a \$2500 community Grant and to apply to International Foundation for additional grant of \$2500 for the Laura foundation summer camps. It was unanimously approved
- Pat McCoy proposed a joint program with the North Conway Community Center to offer Moose
  with a Uke. The members voted to spend up to \$500 to co-sponsor this program and provide
  books to the children attending. Motion passed unanimously.
- Days for Girls A motion was made to increase our budget for Days for Girls from \$500 to \$750.
   These funds will be used to purchase panties & wash clothes and will be given to the Merrimack Valley club to use in their kits. The remaining funds will be sent as a donation to help with purchasing other items needed.

There was a discussion about Pond Hockey, Community Service meeting, and Book Bags for Babies. The ZOOM meeting ended abruptly at 5:38.

February 6th: Highlights

Thanks to Governor Rita we used the District One ZOOM account so that we could extend our meeting and not be limited to the 45 minutes of the free ZOOM Survey Results:

- Meeting schedule seemed ok with majority of members
- Suggestions for activities: a family picnic at Constitution Park in Ossipee, Game night at Madison Library,
- Community Service Possibilities: Lunch support for Habitat for Humanity (since Woman Build doesn't seem to be on the schedule), project at the Conway are Humane Society, Window Dressers - helping winterize homes - fall project - Make a difference day. Clean up the Kanc in collaboration with the Conway Rotary
- Fundraising: No plant sale or raffle this year, will work on securing dates for Cones with a Cause, and Flatbreads. Another suggestion was the American Legion on Tasker Hill / Fish Fry. We will have the book bins at Hannafords in N. Conway. We will follow up on the Tri-Tek events.
- Reminder that Spring Conference will be held in Andover, MA April 26, 27, 28th. Details were in the DSB Call to Conference. You can view on the <u>districtone.altrusa.org</u>. under news and events.. Call to Conference.
- The membership voted unanimously to use Charitable Gaming funds to support Tamworth Farmers Market (\$250), Valley Promotions (\$250) and the Seacoast club service project (\$250). There was discussion about a donation to the "Brown Church" for help with their devastating flood, but church member Judy Workman asked that we wait until their final assessment had been done... as they are unsure how they are going to proceed.

 You are a member of the club and pay your dues to the club. Those dues help support club activities, like meetings, refreshments, name tags, etc.

#### Altrusa International of Carroll County NH Foundation is the charity associated with the club.

As a club member you support the CC Altrusa Foundation through fundraising. The
money we receive from fundraising is used to provide services to other
organizations and individuals in the form of donations, scholarships, activities like
the DCYF Christmas Party, or the Mail for Me literacy project.

Both the club and the foundation are registered with the State of NH and the foundation is a recognized 501(c3) charity with the IRS. This information is helpful if you ask for donations of goods and services from the community. Any funds that are donated to our Altrusa.. go in to the Foundation account to be used in our charitable works.

We have separate treasurers for the club and the foundation. Barbara Kennett is the club treasurer, she receives dues, then pays dues to District and International on before of the members.

Cathy Baybutt is the treasurer for the foundation. She writes the reimbursement checks for the starting point bags, Days for Girls purchases etc as well as the donation checks that are sent out.







## **Plans for Spring Conference**


