Her daughter Pam had decorated her door with pink, yellow, and blue bunnies. Inside, she has a spacious living room with a loveseat sofa, separate upholstered cozy chair, table, and windows facing west, a small kitchenette at the entrance, a spacious bathroom with everything, and a gorgeous bedroom with windows also facing Silver Lake.

We had a lively conversation catching up on the family news from all three of us. Each of Susannah's children calls and checks in on her; most nights Pam puts mom to bed. Three Days in June by Anne Tyler

Queen of quirky tales, winner of a Pulitzer Prize (Breathing Lessons), and shortlisted for the Man Booker Prize (A Spool of Blue Thread), Tyler serves up another gem in her 25th novel. Gail Baines experiences the loss of a job, the sudden appearance of her former husband looking for a room to stay for their daughter's wedding (he comes with a rescue cat), the husband to be is deathly allergic to cats, she isn't invited to her daughter's bridal spa day, and something happens that their daughter considers canceling the wedding. In the midst of these domestic disasters, Tyler brings her tart sense of humor, Austen-like observation of human nature, and wisdom. Just like real life, the novel is not predictable, and happily it is not tragic.

Mary Hecht's Vegan Pumpkin Chocolate Chip Cookies

- ¼ Cup pumpkin puree (canned plain pumpkin, not pumpkin pie
- ½ Cup maple syrup
- ½ Cup + 2 tablespoons roasted creamy/drippy almond butter
- 1½ Teaspoons vanilla extract
- 1 ¼ Cups superfine oat flour
- 1. Preheat oven to 350F; cover a cookie sheet with parchment paper.
- 2. Mix dry ingredients oat flour, pumpkin spice, baking soda and salt in a bowl.
- 3. Add pumpkin, maple syrup, almond butter and vanilla. Stir well until completely smooth.
- 4. Stir in the chocolate chips thoroughly, making a sticky, moist consistent batter.
- 5. Scoop about 2 tablespoons of batter onto the sheet, about 2 inches apart. Wet your fingertips with water to press down each cookie to ¼ inch thickness, using a circular patting motion to flatten the evenly. With wet fingertips press along the edges of each to keep the cookies round.
- 6. Add a few extra chips on top. Bake for 10-12 minutes, until puffed up and the edges are golden brown. A dark pan will bake them a little faster and crispier.
- 7. Cool on the pan for 10 minutes. Then use a spatula and place on a cooking rack. They will firm and crisp up as they cool, but the next day they will be softer, and still tasty.

- 4 Teaspoons pumpkin pie spice
- 1/1 Teaspoons baking soda
- ¼ Teaspoon fine salt
- ½ Cup (120g) dairy-free chocolate chips


