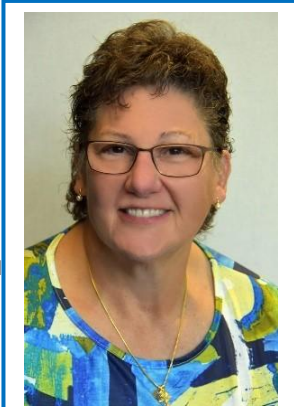

Stuffed Shells Florentine recipe

30 jumbo pasta shells (You should be able to stuff this many, but want to cook a few extras for those that break)

1 1/2 TBSP olive oil

2 tsp fresh garlic, minced

4 cups (packed) spinach leaves, roughly chopped

12 oz ricotta cheese

1 Cup grated Mozzarella cheese

1 large egg

1 TBSP fresh basil finely chopped

1 tsp kosher salt

1/2 tsp black pepper

1/2 Cup grated Parmesan cheese, more for serving

1 jar marinara sauce

1. Cook the pasta al dente. Drain and spread on baking sheet. Preheat the oven to 375 degrees.

2. Heat the oil in large skillet over medium heat, when oil starts to shimmer add the garlic and cook about a minute.

Add spinach and cook, stirring occasionally until leaves begin to wilt but are still bright green--3-4 minutes.

Remove from heat and let cool.

3. In a mixing bowl, stir together spinach, ricotta, Mozzarella, Parmesan, egg, basil and salt and pepper until thoroughly combined.

Pour 3/4 cup of sauce in bottom of shallow 11X13 baking dish.

Stuff each pasta shell with the spinach ricotta mixture and place in baking dish.

4. Cover with remaining sauce and bake covered with aluminum foil for 25 minutes. Remove foil and continue baking until top begins to brown and sauce is bubbling, another 10-12 minutes. Dust with parmesan to serve.

Thank you Civitans for giving me the opportunity to join you in serving our Middlesex Chamber of Commerce!

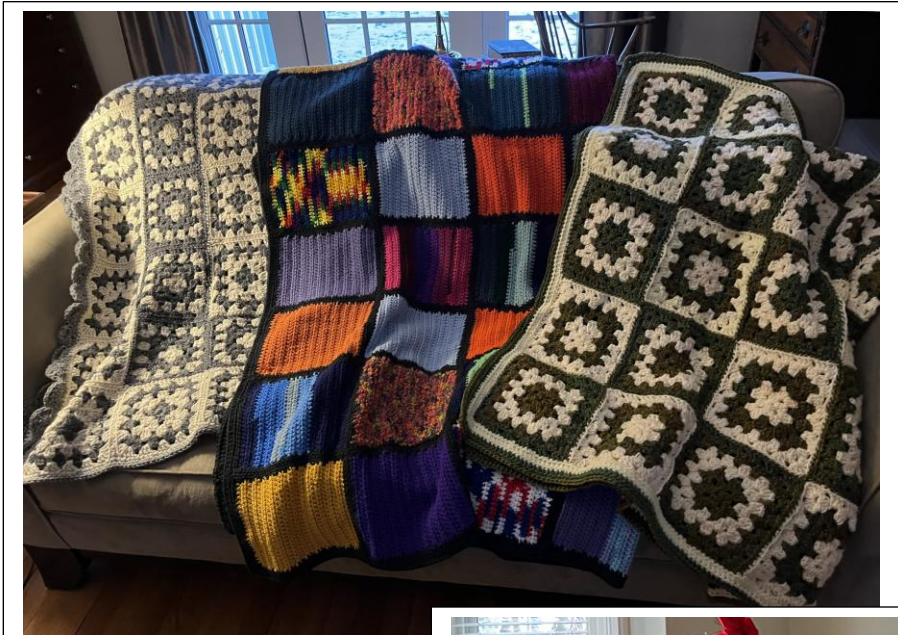

Just What Is the Lamplighter Program?

The International Foundation is grateful for the level of support from Altrusans who make the Lamplighter giving series possible. The Lamplighter Program began in 1987 to recognize Altrusans who contribute or on whose behalf \$500 or more to the International Foundation on an annual basis. Lamplighter members receive a gold pin upon their first gift, then a diamond is awarded for each subsequent \$500 yearly gift. The pin can accommodate 24 diamonds. An Altrusa Club or District may also become a Foundation Lamplighter with a \$500 contribution. The Altrusa Club or District receives a Lamplighter patch for their banner upon the initial contribution and a special pin for each yearly donation thereafter acknowledging their status.
