The session provided valuable insight into how artificial intelligence can be used as a creative and practical tool. Some of the new newsletter page layouts and committee headers in this issue were inspired by ideas explored during that workshop.

As printing costs for our traditional tri-fold brochure continue to rise, Beth and Cathy have been working on a new rack card design as a cost-effective alternative. A sample is included in this newsletter. Beth will obtain printing estimates, and the proposal will be reviewed by the Board of Directors before moving forward.

Our club continues to benefit from excellent community visibility. Cathy D regularly shares the *Charity Chatter* newsletter from MWV Promotions, keeping members informed about nonprofit activities throughout the Mount Washington Valley. Through our membership in MWV Promotions, Altrusa is frequently featured in the *Valley Vision* page of the *Conway Daily Sun* and occasionally highlighted through interviews on Channel 3. Cathy D also keeps our club storyboard updated for display at community events.

The Literacy Committee met on May 19, 2026, to review current programs and plan for the coming year. Members voted unanimously to continue the **Mail for Me** program for another year while exploring ways to increase participation among schools and provide additional support for teachers.

The **Make Way for Readers** program continues to grow, with updated preschool and library contact lists being developed to expand outreach throughout the community.



The **Baby Book Bags** program continues to connect young families with books and literacy resources. Altrusa partners with the Tamworth and Freedom libraries to provide these special book bags to families with newborns. The committee will approach the Madison Library to explore the possibility of partnering with Altrusa and expanding the program to serve additional families in the community. Special thanks were extended to Becky for her beautiful monogramming work on the bags.

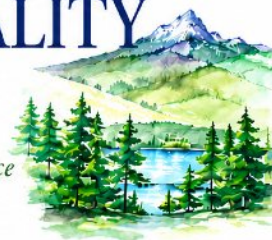
The annual **Hannaford Book Fundraiser** raised approximately **\$270**, helping support literacy initiatives throughout the community. Plans are also underway to purchase additional

books for younger children attending the **DCYF Christmas Party**.

Members reviewed donation projects and approved continuing support for **Once Upon a Storytime** and the **MWVHC Baby Shower** program. Funding was also reserved for a future literacy project. The committee's proposed budget for 2026–2027 is **\$3,300**, with current-year expenditures totaling **\$2,403**.

Looking ahead, the committee will gather more information about the **TCNA Children's Story Walk** and explore opportunities to collaborate with the **Believe in Books Literacy Foundation**.

To share surplus children's books with the community, committee members will begin stocking several local free libraries this summer, helping place books directly into the hands of young readers throughout the Mount Washington Valley.
